The BC Assembly of First Nations (the "BCAFN") is seeking candidates to fill the position of Policy Advisor.

Responsibilities

The Policy Advisor is responsible for assisting the Regional Chief and the Director of Operations in carrying out the BCAFN's mission statement in accordance with direction provided by BCAFN members and the BCAFN Board of Directors. Specific responsibilities include, but are not limited to: conducting research on assigned policy, program, legislative or other issues; preparing speaking notes, briefing notes, reports, correspondence and other communications materials; implementing resolutions passed by BCAFN members, and liaising and working collaboratively with other organizations on issues/initiatives that may arise from time to time.

The Policy Advisor reports to the Director of Operations.

Education and Experience

Candidates for the position must have a university degree from a recognized post-secondary institution and a minimum of five years' experience as a policy analyst or policy advisor, preferably for a First Nations provincial/territorial organization. Candidates must also have strong leadership, interpersonal and organizational skills, excellent written and oral communication skills, excellent time management skills and knowledge of First Nations political and legal issues.

Preference will be given to persons of Aboriginal ancestry.

Salary is negotiable and commensurate with education and experience.
